Abstract: In this talk we will explore symmetries of geometric and algebraic structures and realize elegant connections that continue to inspire research in algebraic geometry.

About the speaker: Katherine Stevenson is a Professor of Mathematics at CSU Northridge, where she has taught since 2001. She earned her B.S. from Mount Holyoke College in 1989 and her Ph.D. from The University of Pennsylvania in 1994. Her research interests focus on Algebraic Geometry, particularly inverse Galois problems for curves.
